Team Rules

Consequences for Breaking the Rules

First infraction: warning
Second infraction: 30 minute detention
Third infraction: 45 minute detention, call to parents, and a conduct grade of "N" for the grading period during which the infraction occurred.

All subsequent infractions will be referred to the grade level principal following parent notification. In addition, a conduct grade of "U" will be given during each grading period that an office referral is made. Please note: The record of disciplinary infractions continues all year.

Tardies are handled separately, following the same progression of steps. The record of tardies start over at the beginning of the second semester.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ANY ASSIGNMENT TO ISS (In School Suspension) WILL LIKELY DISQUALIFY A STUDENT FROM ATTENDING FIELD TRIPS.

Grading Policy/ Make-up Work & Retests

Major work will count two-thirds (66.7%) of the six week grade, and daily work will count one-third (33.3%). (EXCEPTION for ALGEBRA – 75%: major & 25%: daily & SPANISH I – 70%/30%.)

Daily grades will be accepted ONLY one day late without a penalty. A working lunch detention to complete work may be assigned. A 30 point penalty will be assessed on the 2nd day a daily grade is late from the grade earned. MOST major grade assignments such as projects and essays may also be turned in late up to 3 days with a 10 point penalty per day. After the 3rd day, a zero will be given. History spirals MUST be turned in and graded the day they are due.

Test retakes must be arranged with the teacher and completed within one week of test failure notification. Failure to do so will result in retention of the original grade. Algebra students may NOT retake failed tests or quizzes for a 75 because the class is Pre-AP/high school credit.

Following an absence, <u>students</u> are responsible for obtaining missed work. Students will be given the number of days missed plus one day to complete make-up work. Failure to do so will result in zeros being given for missed assignments.

Team Pride teachers strongly encourage our students to seek assistance when help is needed.

Binders


- one 2 or 3 inch binder (for English, history and math)
- one 1 inch binder for science
- pocket folder w/brads for math (plastic lasts longer)
- pocket folder w/brads for homework (plastic lasts longer)
- Dividers (you will need 4, total for Team Pride)
- Notebook paper
- Six 70-page spirals (Bound with metal spiral works best! NO multi-subject, please!!!)
 - 2 for history, 1 for science, 1 for English and 2 for math/algebra. Bring one for each class @ the beginning of school and keep the second history/math/algebra spirals at home or in your locker for 2nd semester.
 - Spiral covers will be decorated and labeled in class.
- **Pencil pouch** to hold the following items:
 - blue or black pens
 - #2 pencils (if mechanical please bring extra lead)
 - two red pens for editing and grading
 - two highlighters, any color
 - scissors (needed daily in science and history)
 - one ruler (12"/30 cm)
 - eraser
 - four AAA batteries (give to Mrs. Desai or Mrs. Restivo)

* <u>Science</u> will require a <u>separate</u>, one-inch binder with no dividers. However, you will need to bring your Team Binder to science or create another pencil pouch with the same supplies that are listed above (pens, red pens, pencils, glue, scissors, highlighter, etc...)



Team Pride Detention Policy



(Scheduled at the Teacher's Convenience)

- 1. While serving detention, students will not be allowed to talk, study, read, work on homework, text or sleep. Students will sit straight with their hands on the desk. No talking or sleeping will be allowed.
- 2. When a student is assigned a detention, his or her teacher will arrange a date and time. Once the date and time is agreed upon, the detention must be served on that day.
- 3. When a student is assigned a detention, he/she will receive a detention notice that MUST be signed by a parent and returned at the beginning of the scheduled detention.
- 4. Arrival time for detention is 3:55 P.M., sharp! Students with a thirty minute detention will be released at 4:25 P.M., and students with a forty-five minute detention will be released at 4:40 P.M.
 - Students MUST be on time; arrival after the scheduled beginning time (without prior notification) will result in rescheduling of the detention and necessary disciplinary action (see #6 or #7 below).
- 5. The student MUST bring his/her detention notice to detention, signed by the appropriate parent or guardian.
- 6. If a student does not attend a scheduled thirty minute detention, the time-will be increased to forty-five minutes and the student's parents will be notified. A second failure to attend will result in an office referral.
- 7. If a student does not attend a scheduled forty-five minute detention, an office referral will be made. Students are not given a second chance on forty-five minute detentions because parent notification will have already occurred prior to the detention.
- 8. Students are responsible for making travel arrangements prior to the detention. Students who serve a detention are not eligible to ride the tutorial bus.
